# CC & Judges

- Experience from BDCC open & sports competitions
- Open competition
  - Judges strange opinions and biases
  - *“I don’t like American football & prefer rugby”*
  - One sports shot is *“amazing”* and gets 20, and the next is also *“amazing”* and gets 15
- Sports image competition
  - Judges need to be carefully briefed as to what your club defines as a sport image

## Elements of a “Sports Image” for Club Competitions

- **IM-ever-so-HO** this is what I would define a Sports image:
  - Contain a competitive element in the image. Without this, it's just people doing stuff
  - Tell a story indicating what just happened and/or what might happen next
  - Does not require your memory of the event to understand the story
  - Be a recognisable sport, don't leave the judge guessing
  - Include something happening, ie behaviour, action, reaction etc. Nothing “static”
  - Have a human connection, ie eyes, expression, emotion etc
  - Does **NOT** have to be fast action team sport
    - But I admit most of my images are action



What are you trying to capture in a sports image ?



- Individual athlete or subject
  - Tennis
  - Track & Field
  - Swimming
  - Cricket
  - Car timed events (hill climbs, sprints, drag)
  - Water sports (jet skis, kayaks, skulls, canoes)
  - Equestrian
- Group action
  - Football (soccer & American)
  - Rugby
  - Hockey
  - Racing (car, bike, horse, dogs)
- Emotion, reactions, celebrations
- Fast action shot or something else



Keep your expectations within reason



- Keep in mind the shots you see in the media are taken by experts who do it for a living, often with VERY expensive and specialized kit and from exclusive locations
- One image might have taken years, and 1000's shots, to obtain

How can you be creative and find something different ?

- Remember the image **does not** have to be fast action shot (part of comp definition ?)
- Shoot within your
  - Physical limits - take a lightweight stool or foldable seat
  - Camera & lens limits - borrow or hire a lens, look for different angle
- Think of what you would like to capture
- Inspiration - Have a look online at images from your chosen sport, pick one or two “types/styles” you’d like to capture
- Think about how you can get that image
  - What access will you need
  - What do you want/not want in the background
  - Where to stand/crouch/sit/kneel



## Stick to a single sport



- Don't go to single game, match, or race and expect to get an award winning image
- You need to go multiple times to get the image(s) you want to capture
- Doesn't need to be 10 times, but certainly more than twice
- Same as any photography genre, the better you know the subject, the better images you get



Stick to a single sport



- By going to the same sport min 2-3x you will begin to:
  - Predict when and where the action or behaviour occurs
  - Position yourself to capture the action or behaviour
  - Have the camera & lens setup and ready
  - Have a better understanding of your gear and what you can/can't do with it
  - **Improve your “Luck” !**



## Stick to a single sport



- If you already know a sport then you'll know when something is likely to happen
- If you go to a sport that you've never seen before (for example Lacrosse)
  - Initially put the camera away and watch
  - Get an understanding of what might happen, and why and where it might happen



## Ideas for image content

- Static image of a sports person needs to be sharp, well exposed and well composed, but if the athletes are not **competing** it's a "record shot"
- Same for all types of wheeled & motor sports





## Competitive element



- Indicators of competition
  - More than one competitor in the image
  - Team colors, competitor numbers, car numbers
  - Tension between competitors
  - Determination shown by the competitors
  - Eyes watching other competitors
  - Crowds

## Elements of a Sports image

- Choose the background
- Isolate subject(s) from background ?
- Reduce clutter
- Composition
- Eye line
- Emotion
- The crowd, officials, etc
- Freezing the action
- Follow the ball
- Panning blur

## Reduce Clutter



- Isolate the focus of the image
- Avoid/remove partial body parts



# Composition

- As with most photography genre, the background of the image is all important
- For sports having the background out of focus is one way to reduce the it's impact
- Position yourself around the event to avoid or reduce the impact of people, adverts, vehicles, bright lights, etc in the background
- Blurring the background using a panning motion can also isolate the subject from a busy background

# Composition

- Don't shoot "anything and everything"
- Don't try to capture the story like the MOTD highlights
  - You're shooting for CC Judge !
- Try and stick to the plan
- Normal composition rules still apply, leading lines, lighter vs darker to focus attention, etc
- If you're clever (more likely lucky) you can get some symmetry in the athletes movement

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# The Eyes

- Capturing the eyes gives the viewer a connection to the athlete, seeing their intentions, what they might be thinking about
- The eyes add interest to the image, similar to wildlife photography
- The eyes help to tell the story within the image

## Below the eye line

- Photographer needs to be below the eye line of the players/athletes
- People naturally look downwards, so you're more likely to catch their eyes and expression
- Background looks more "natural" from below the eye line perspective. The background is also less cluttered
- Next time you look at a media sport image, most will have this perspective
- But not all, as we know photography rules are to be broken

# Emotion

- You're not shooting a sport, you're shooting people **competing** in a sport, for a CC judge !
- By capturing facial expressions in your images you connect your audience with the competitors
  - Glee
  - Joy
  - Excitement
  - Determination
  - Pain
  - Despondency
  - Anger
  - Frustration
  - Surprise
  - Shock
- Body language also expresses emotion

## The Crowd



- The crowd are less inhibited than normal when
  - their team/competitor is doing well
  - something exciting has just happened
- Combining the crowd with some action, or the sport competitors doing something, can make a great image
- Crowd can be a bit out of focus in the background to add atmosphere

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## Freezing the action

- Predict or anticipate the action
- Start shooting as the players begin to jump for the ball, or charge in for the tackle – this way you have a better chance to catch them as they make contact
  - “Controlled spray and pray”
- Fill the frame as much as possible
  - Wait for players to come closer, zoom in, or move to a position closer to the action
  - Trust the camera to capture the focus
- With hi-res 20-46Mb cameras, post crop images if you don't have enough optical zoom

## Freezing the action

- A snapshot in time is not interesting unless the viewer can tell, or infer:
  - what's just happened before the image was taken
  - what's happening at the instance the image was taken
  - what will happen after the image was taken
- This is telling a story, and we know the judges love a story

## Follow the ball

- What ever is the center of attention for the competitors (ball, puck, etc) try and keep it within image
- Doesn't have to be in focus
- Helps to tell the story of the action, gives a focal point to the image

# Panning blur

- This is another technique to pop the action from the background
- Gives an impression of speed and action. Good for Camera Club comps, and wall prints
- Use when the motion is predictable (generally from side to side) like motor & water sports
- Can work in other sports but more difficult to get a successful shot
- Avoid any bright things in the background (cars, ads, banners or lights) as they add a bright streak to the background when blurred
- ... Unless of course, that's the effect you're after

# ISO & image noise

- Generally to balance shutter & aperture you'll have to use higher ISO than you're used to
- Use **Auto-ISO** if your camera has it
- If not, then take a few shots with different ISO's to get something about right. You might need to go to ISO 5000 or higher
- Lightroom Denoise or similar will help reduce the noise for the final image
- But maybe the noise can be part of the creative shot ?

## How do you choose a sport ?

- Perhaps you have an idea(s) of your image content
- Perhaps you want a new challenge
- You need something local - ie probably not Caber Tossing in the Highland Games
- You're not interested in fast action sport
- Your camera & lens might limit your options
- Your physical capabilities might limit options

### **Guy's Advice**

- Stick to outside sports with daylight being the main light source
- Shooting inside is another level of complexity best avoided
- Try borrowing or if you can afford it, renting a different (longer ?) lens for a weekend

# Privacy & Safeguarding

- Privacy
  - Most local sport teams will be OK with you taking images
  - It's polite and professional to ask first
  - Offer to share any good images
  - Explain you are learning and nothing will be used on-line, or money made from the images
- Safeguarding
  - Avoid shooting children younger than 14 years. Technically, if they are in the crowd it's OK. But better to play safe
  - Don't get involved
- Use your common sense

## Final thoughts

- Final tip: Get there early and shoot the warm ups. Often teams practise team actions, scrums, tackles, penalties, etc
- Shoot lots and often. Pixels are cheap. Take spare **charged** battery(s) & memory card(s)
- Dress to be comfortable & dry. If you're cold, hot or uncomfortable you won't enjoy it
- Hopefully you'll learn a little more about your camera and a new skill
- Fire away and enjoy the day
